Ancient Latvian Ceramic



Ceramic product creation is one of the oldest crafts industries. Already in the Stone Age people in the world starts to use a simple clay to prepare the dishes in which to store excess farm, cook meals, as well as the clay used in the cult objects and ornaments injection. Each region of Latvia has special characteristic shape, ornamentation and color ceramics. Latgale region pottery is particularly famous. It is characterized by brightly colored glazed pots, cup, bowls, vases, candlesticks and whistlers (objects that, when blown into, make whistle-like sounds).

Wicker Tress



"Wicker " members of a fine cloth, mesh material divided into four parts, use the special weaving techniques figured combination also creates artistic value. Basketry uses natural materials - wicker , cane, straw. Each work is individual and unique , and specific to the Latgale region.

Metalsmithers



Metalsmithing is creating jewelry through the manipulation of various metals. Metalsmith

need needs to know manipulations or metalsmithing techniques including fabricating metal jewelry by forming and shaping it with hammers, mandrels, and other tools, sawing with a jeweler's saw or cutting with metal snips. Jewelers often refer to their craft as metalsmithing, and many universities offer degree programs in metalsmithing, jewelry, enameling and blacksmithing under the auspices of their fine arts programs.
